

Macomb County Administration Building

The new Macomb County Administration Building is scheduled for completion in the summer of 1998. Encompassing 129,500 square feet, the new building will reach nine floors in height and be connected via tunnel to the County Building.

The building facade, primarily of glass and aluminum curtain wall, emphasizes and reflects the historic detail of the existing County Building located directly across Cass Avenue. The exterior wall column structure and building core elements are expressed in precast concrete with granite finish at the plaza level. The touches of granite maximize durability while maintaining similar finishes to the base of the County Building.

Featured on top of the building are a lighted penthouse and spire. The brightly lighted top creates a prominent visual landmark, a sort of "Beacon of the County." The beacon is visible from any direction, including Lake St. Clair.

Six County departments are initially scheduled to occupy space in the new building. Approximately two floors will remain unfinished and be available for future use.

A Brief History of Macomb County

Named in honor of General Alexander Macomb, a highly decorated veteran of the War of 1812, Macomb County was formally organized on January 15, 1818 as the third County in the Michigan Territory. At that time, it covered a much larger area than it does today. In 1819 and 1820, large portions of the County were removed to form the Counties of Oakland, Lapeer, Genesee and St. Clair.

The first Europeans arrived in the area during the 17th century. They included French fur trappers who recognized the richness of the marshes and sought new opportunities for trade. The first organized, non-native settlement in the County was established in 1782 by Moravian missionaries as a refuge for Christianized Indians driven out of Ohio. They built along the banks of the Clinton River, then known as the Huron River, but were forced to leave four years later by the Chippewa Indians. In the late 1790s, Christian Clemens visited the area and in March, 1800, purchasd a distillery considered the first building on the site of the future Mount Clemens. The next year he purchased 500 acres for development. This site, known as High Banks, was platted as the village of Mount Clemens in 1818, when it was proclaimed the Macomb County Seat.


In the early 1800s, and at least by 1840, settlers moved into the interior of the County, carving out farms from the hardwood forests. The roots of the county villages and townships were established by this time. In addition to the original French and English, later settlers included Germans, Belgians and others who came directly from Europe.


In the 1870s, mineral baths brought international fame to Mount Clemens. Many believed the waters had healing powers. Although the stream still runs beneath the city, interest in the spas died out in the early 20th century.

Between 1920 and 1930, Macomb County doubled in population, rising from 38,103 to 77,146 persons. Two significant developments spurred this growth – the establishment of Selfridge Field in 1917, and the beginning of the urbanization movement northward from the City of Detroit. During the 1940s and 1950s the movement from the central city to the suburbs increased. The largest growth occurred between 1950 and 1970, when over 440,000 people were added to the County's population.

Today, Macomb County encompasses 482 square miles, and ranks third in population in the State, with a 1990 census total of 717,400 persons. The County is recognized as a leader in business and industry, and designated as a "Community of Economic Excellence" by the State.





After the primary and general elections, the Board reviews and analyzes the results to determine who has been nominated in primary elections and which candidates are elected in general elections. After general elections, the Board delivers certificates of election to the County Clerk. The Board is also empowered to conduct recounts in certain elections.

licenses, business registrations, notary public commissions, military discharges, and concealed weapons permits. The clerk was the first major county clerk's office to provide overnight document delivery to customer's who fax requests for birth certificates and other vital records.

This department is responsible for overseeing the printing and distribution of election ballots, conducting national, state and county elections, and compliance with the Michigan Campaign Finance Act. It also handles the canvass of votes in state, county, school, village and some city and township elections. The elections staff became the first to enlist amateur radio operators to relay election results on election night, and the first to broadcast election results on public access cable TV directly from the Internet.

Circuit Court Section Phone: 469-5351, Fax: 783-8184 The Clerk is designated as the Clerk of the Macomb County 16th Judicial Circuit Court. This section processes court filings. The clerk computerized the judge selection process to prevent the possibility of "judge shopping."

File Room Section Phone: 469-5199, Fax: 783-8184 This section maintains all of the files of the 16th Judicial Circuit Court. All documents filed with the Court are entered onto the Court computer system daily. The computers and files may be accessed by the public at the counter in the Circuit Court.

Jury Room

This section oversees the operation of the Jury Room for the Circuit and Probate Courts. Selection of jurors is randomly made by a computer with a list of resident drivers and persons with a Michigan identification card. The term of jury service is either one week or one trial.

With a new state-of-the-art, electronic imaging system, this office records all deeds and mortgages and subdivision plats located within Macomb County. The public may access property records in the office from computer terminals to determine if any Federal or State tax liens exist. Many original documents may be viewed and printed from the computer screen. Records on file include deeds, mortgages, attachments, lis pendens, mechanics' liens, Sheriff's deeds and financing statements for personal property.



The Macomb County Circuit Court is called a trial court of general jurisdiction because it has jurisdiction over all actions except those given by state law to another court. In general, it has jurisdiction in civil cases involving more than \$25,000; domestic relations cases (usually divorce); cases seeking equitable relief; felony criminal cases and some serious misdemeanors. The Court also has jurisdiction over appeals from district courts, appeals from certain administrative agencies and superintending control over the Macomb County district courts.

Beginning January 1, 1998, the Michigan Legislature created the Family Division of Circuit Court in all circuit courts. The Family Division of Circuit Court incorporates the family matters which were formerly assigned to the Probate Court, largely juvenile proceedings. Judge Lido V. Bucci was appointed the Presiding Judge of the Family Division. Probate Judges Antonio P. Viviano and Pamela Gilbert O'Sullivan were assigned to the Family Division of Circuit Court. The Family Division presides over all domestic relations matters and strives to accomplish the "one judge - one family" goal of the Legislature. The county clerk serves as the clerk of the Family Division.

Circuit judges are elected to six-year terms on non-partisan ballots.

COURT ADMINISTRATOR

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The Court Administrator supervises the operation of the Court as its executive officer. The Court Administrator and the Administrative Assistant are problem solvers who make sure that all positions are staffed, resolve logjams in the system, maintain statistics, develop reports for the judges of the Court and the State Court Administrator's Office, and assist in the development and implementation of innovative programs to increase the efficiency of the Court.

The Court Administrator's Office is responsible for the management of the Court's case load, including the scheduling of cases, preparing the weekly motion docket, the handling of the Court rule mediation process and the policing of the Court's docket to make sure that cases proceed expeditiously. The Judicial Aide manages the appointment of attorneys to represent indigent individuals who are charged with felonies in the Court. The Family Counseling Department provides psychological reports in domestic cases upon the order of the Court.

MACOMB COUNTY DISTRICT AND MUNICIPAL COURTS

District Courts have exclusive jurisdiction of all civil litigation up to \$25,000 and also handles garnishments, eviction proceedings, land contract forfeitures, and other proceedings. For criminal cases, the District Court conducts preliminary examinations in felony cases and handles all misdemeanors where punishment does not exceed one year in jail including arraignment, sentence, and setting and acceptance of bail. Civil infractions are also handled in District Court. A Small Claims Division for certain civil claims is provided in the District Court. District judges may appoint magistrates. The magistrates may set ball and accept bond in criminal matters, accept guilty pleas, sentence for traffic, motor carrier, dog, game, snowmobile and boat law violations, and issue arrest and search warrants. Attorney magistrates may hear Small Claims cases. Magistrates may, at the direction of the Chief Judge, perform other duties allowed by statute.

Municipal Court civil jurisdiction is limited to \$1,500. Its criminal jurisdiction is similar to District Court. Municipal judges must be lawyers, residents, and electors of their cities. They are paid by the municipality and are elected for four-year terms as provided by City Charter. They are part-time judges and may practice law outside of the Court room.







There are four major public parks in the County where persons can enjoy a vast array of year-round, recreational activities. County residents are never far from leisure facilities. Located in the city of Sterling Heights, this 100 acre park is easily accessible from all parts of the County. Freedom Hill sponsors many festivals and special events. The park includes the Independence Building, shelters, open-air amphitheater, tot lot, and games area. Visitors enjoy picnicking and related activities on the grounds. The air-conditioned Independence Building, complete with caterer, can be rented for business meetings and social gatherings.

Metro Beach Metropark


At 770 acres, Metro Beach offers 1.25 miles of Lake St. Clair frontage. Facilities include a large lake beach area, swimming pool with water slide, tot lot and play areas, picnic areas and shelters, three marinas, a nature interpretive area, a paved hike/bike trail, boat launch, an 18-hole par 3 golf course, and an 18-hole adventure golf course. An open-air pavilion offers day and evening concerts during the summer months. In the winter, park users enjoy ice fishing, ice skating, and cross-country skiing, weather permitting.

Stony Creek Metropark

Built around the 500 acre Stony Creek Lake in gently rolling terrain, this 4,461 acre metropark offers many recreational activities, including nine large picnic areas, an 18-hole champlonship golf course, nature interpretive area, two swimming beaches, play areas, boat launch, and boat rentals. Ten miles of paved roads and over six miles of hike/bike trails provide scenic tours. Winter visitors can enjoy cross-country skiing, sledding, and Ice skating.

Wolcott Mill Metropark

Now open year-round, this park highlights a historic grist mill on the Clinton River in Ray Township. Situated in a pristine, natural setting, the park offers group tours of the mill and historical programs. A short nature trail is also located near the mill. Currently under development is the Farm Learning Center, covering over 200 acres about 1.5 miles north of the mill, that will demonstrate modern farming practices, house a small dairy herd and other farm animals, and exhibit sample fields of various agricultural crops.
